MidPenn attorneys and paralegals handle cases involving domestic violence, housing law, public benefits, expungement, supportive benefits, consumer law, family law, tax controversies and elder law.

The Legal Services Corporation provides 20.6% of our funds. Additional support comes from the Huntingdon-Bedford-Fulton Area Agency on Aging and individual donors.
