

Lebanon County 2024-2025 Fact Sheet

MidPenn Legal Services fights for low-income families and domestic violence survivors, delivering free legal aid that transforms crisis into stability.

MidPenn Legal Services provides free civil legal aid to low-income families in crisis. MidPenn serves 18 counties in Central Pennsylvania. We provide legal advice and counsel to help very low-income families and survivors of domestic violence solve problems that focus on improving their personal safety, family stability and economic security.

The Pennsylvania Legal Aid Network provides 51.9% of our funding from various sources including, Interest on Lawyer Trust Accounts, state and federal Title XX, filing fee add-ons, and the Disability Advocacy Project. The Legal Services Corporation provides 30.1% of our funds. Additional support comes from the PA Commission on Crime and Delinquency, the Lebanon Area Agency on Aging, the United Way of Lebanon County and individual donors.
