The Year's Impact

In Fiscal Year 2024-2025, MidPenn Legal Services handled 9,744 civil cases in Adams, Bedford, Berks, Blair, Centre, Clearfield, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Huntingdon, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Mifflin, Perry, Schuylkill and York Counties.

Real People, Real Impact

When Edith's son called asking for help getting into rehab, she did not hesitate to provide him with the money to help him get clean and rebuild his life. She then withdrew \$75,000 from her retirement account, believing she was saving her son's life.

But the call Edith was waiting for, the one telling her he had checked into treatment, never came. Instead, her son used every dollar to pay drug dealers and feed his addiction. Edith realized the devastating truth, her money was gone, and so was the son she thought she was helping, when the police arrested him at her home.



The stress of watching her life's savings disappear, of seeing her child in handcuffs, of facing a tax bill of \$12,500 she had no way to pay was too much. She suffered two strokes that left her unable to work. Edith came to MidPenn not asking for a handout, but for a chance to move forward. Our tax attorney went to work on Edith's case and prepared to negotiate with the IRS on her behalf. He filed an Offer in Compromise, presenting her case to the IRS with the compassion and expertise she deserved. Through his advocacy the IRS accepted a payment of \$1,000 to settle Edith's \$12,500 liability.

The outcome? Edith had one less burden to carry as she works to heal and rebuild her life.



At 36, Lisa lives with cerebral palsy and has multiple medical conditions which require her to rely on her mother for everything including completing essential daily tasks. When homelessness forced them to move in with relatives, Lisa sought stability and independence and applied for Home and Community Based Care through the County Assistance Office. Lisa worked to gather all the necessary documentation to support her need for services, but her application was denied.

When Lisa contacted MidPenn, our attorney reviewed all the paperwork and appealed the denial of services.

Through our advocacy the decision was reversed, and Lisa was approved for 40 hours of care. Even better, Lisa received other essential public benefits that she desperately needed.

The outcome? Lisa finally has a real path toward the independence and stability that she sought.



Real People, Real Impact



In 2018, when Jacob was 81, a professional guardian was appointed to handle his finances.

Several years later, the guardian sent an email to the judge seeking to take control of all aspects of Jacob's life, not just his money. The guardian wanted to move him into a care facility. Why? Because Jacob was missing some doctor appointments, and the guardian thought Jacob walked too much. In addition, the guardian convinced Jacob to sign medical privacy forms to let him talk to his doctors even though he was only supposed to be handling his finances. The guardian also charged Jacob an additional \$600 a month for these extra services.

When our attorney was appointed by the court to represent Jacob, she looked for less restrictive solutions including arranging for transportation services to get him to and from his medical appointments and providing him with a cell phone so his doctor's office could reach him.

The guardian opposed these ideas, and our attorney explained that if the guardian wanted more control over Jacob's life, a petition should be filed with the court seeking a plenary guardianship. The guardian chose not to file a petition for plenary guardianship and instead worked with our advocate and another organization to try the less restrictive options.

The outcome? Jacob is living safely and happily in his own home with his roommate—maintaining his independence.



Access To Justice

Attorney James P. DeAngelo received the Justice Ambassador Award for spearheading MidPenn's Pursuing Justice-Improving Lives Campaign.
