MidPenn attorneys and paralegals handle cases involving domestic violence, housing law, public benefits, expungement, supportive benefits, consumer law, family law, tax controversies and elder law.

The Legal Services Corporation provides 20.6% of our funds. Additional support comes from the Centre County Office of Aging, the Centre Foundation, the Centre County Housing and Land Trust, the State College Community Land Trust and individual donors.
